We are looking forward to another wonderful school year with your children. During the first few days of school, we spend a lot of time acclimating our students back to school and teaching/reteaching school-wide expectations and procedures through our rodeo and kick-off assembly. Helping our students understand school culture and appropriate school behaviors is important. Please ask your child two things they learn about the classroom, hallway, lunchroom, and playground expectations. We will again continue with our recognitions, celebrations, and boosters so, look forward to hearing your child talk about these milestones. Student attendance continues to be important and counts. Any student dropped off after school has started or picked up during school will need to come to the office at entrance A. Parent/Guardians must accompany the student to the office when arriving late. The first bell for school to start rings at 8:22 am and students should be in their classroom by 8:27 am. There is no supervision before school until 8:10 am so please do not drop your child off at school until this time unless they are in the YMCA Extended Learning Program.

In order to help ensure the safety of our students and your child, please make sure you sign in to our office when you come to visit during school hours. You must have an identification pass issued by the office if you would like to enter the building beyond the office.

Having updated medical information and contacts in Infinite Campus is important. Please update your child's medical plans and contacts. <u>Medical forms</u> can be found on our District's website.

Field trip opportunities will be offered to support learning beyond the classroom and to enhance student learning. Although field trips are not part of the free/reduced qualification, whatever families can afford to contribute does help. Should there be any financial hardship that prevents students from taking part in the field trip, please do not hesitate to communicate this to your child's teacher or the office. We do not want students to be excluded from a field trip for economic reasons.

Thank you for entrusting the education and safety of your child to the staff at Johnston Elementary School. We are partners in educating your child and we welcome you on this year's journey.

From the school nurse: Beginning of Year Reminders

Hello and welcome to the 2023-2024 school year! We are excited to see your students back and we look forward to working with them. In order to help ensure we have the most up to date information for those students with health conditions, please remember to fill out an updated health condition plan which can be found <u>here</u>. Please return these to your student's school office once completed.



Any medication that will be kept at school must have a new medication administration form completed each school year.

Please note, if your student has a health plan that lists their medication and dosing, you do not need to also complete a medication administration form. All medications must come in their original packaging or pharmacy bottle with the student's name and dosing information. If your student is in middle or high school and you would like them to receive the stock medication, you will need to give permission for them to receive these medications. Please reach out to your student's school to get more information.

Per Wisconsin law, students are required to be fully immunized or have a signed <u>waiver</u> on file. To see the current state requirements please see this <u>letter</u> from the Department of Health Services. If your child has not yet received the appropriate immunizations, please schedule an appointment with your health care provider or the City of Appleton Health Department/Outagamie County Health Department. Additional information about vaccination requirements can be found <u>here</u>. If you have any questions please reach out to your school nurse.

Lastly, every day your student attends school matters! If a student misses 10 days per year for the lifetime of their school career, that adds up to 140 days... almost a full school year. Research and experience teach us that students with poor attendance are at greater risk for school difficulty. Making up missed schoolwork is very helpful, but missed classroom instruction cannot be made up. If you have concerns about getting your student to school or have questions about when to keep your student home, **please** reach out to their school to discuss.
