Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are writing this letter to inform you of our upcoming standardized English test, ACCESS for English Learner's (ELs). As mandated by Wisconsin law, one of our primary responsibilities is to assess the English language skills of eligible students and provide information to you. Our overall goal is to provide language and academic support so that ELs reach their full potential and participate fully in their educational experience. Students are only eligible to exit the EL program with a current ACCESS level. If your child does not take the ACCESS test during the testing window, he/she will not be able to exit EL programming this academic year.

In the next two to three months, the ACCESS test will be administered to all ELs in the Appleton Area School District. The results will provide information about the language and literacy needs of your child. After the tests have been corrected and scored, we will share the results with you.

In some cases, your child already participates in the district's EL / Bilingual Program. For others, there is no direct language service or services have been refused, but we are required by law to administer the assessment to all EL students. Please understand that discussion of any direct service will involve you, and no student will be placed in EL classes without your permission.

Johnston Elementary School will be administering the ACCESS test December 4 - 13, 2023. If you have any questions about the ACCESS test, please contact the EL teachers listed below at your child's school.

#### **Attendance Matters!**

Help us help your child develop good attendance habits. Research has shown that attendance habits that are established by the second grade can have lifelong effects on our children and their chances for success. Absences do add up and improving attendance rates at any point and any grade can have positive outcomes for students. Together, let's give the tools to our children to be successful throughout their education and into their adult lives. Please be reminded of the following:

- The school bell rings at 8:22. Students should be in their classrooms before the 8:27 bell. Supervision on the playground begins at 8:10 a.m.
- Parents/guardians can excuse students for up to 10 days. (full/partial/tardy/etc.); beyond the 10-day marker, documentation is needed to remain an excused absence.
- Student absences need to be reported to the school by 9:00 a.m. or it will be considered "unexcused."
- If your child is late or tardy it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to bring the child into the office and sign him/her in before going to the classroom. This will ensure that your child enters the building safely and that our attendance records are accurate.

Traffic and parking rules around schools are created for the safety of the students. Please follow all posted signs. A suggestion to avoid traffic congestion is to park further away from school and let your child cross the street at a crossing guard, safety patrol, or marked or unmarked crosswalk. Never let your child cross between parked cars or mid-block! The school parking lot is NOT a drop-off zone; this is because we have many students crossing in front of the lot on the sidewalk and reducing the traffic in/out allows for safe walking of our students. There are signs on both entrances to the parking to help guide car entrance. Both ends of the parking lot will be barricaded and enforced as guided by the signs.

#### Does Good Attendance Matter?



Success Starts with Attendance
If a student misses 10 days per year for the lifetime of
their school career, that adds up to 140 days... almost a
full school year. Research and experience teach us that
students with poor attendance are at greater risk for
school difficulty. Making up missed schoolwork is very
helpful, but missed classroom instruction cannot be
made up.

We try to impress upon students that there is a difference between "not feeling well" and being truly sick. We all know there are times when we do not feel 100%, but still try to make it through the day. Students understand that parents do this in order to keep their jobs. This is a real "life skill" that employers look for when hiring. They want employees they can count on to come to work. For students, school is their job.

Common sense can guide parents in deciding when a child is sick enough to be at home. If you are uncertain about sending your child to school, please reference <u>Is Your Child Well Enough to Go to School</u> from our district website or please call us. Sometimes a second opinion can be of help! Not only is school attendance a legal requirement, it encourages behavior that will help your child be successful in life. So while the goal of "perfect attendance" may not be realistic for all, <u>great school attendance</u> is something to work towards!

#### Here are some helpful tips:

- Schedule appointments outside of school hours
- Request beginning or end of day appointments
- If appropriate, consider having child return for ½ day if feeling better.
- Ask your provider to write a letter for the time they missed from school


